WOW, is this a great opportunity for all of us CWS art lovers to attend and enjoy the Clyfford Still Museum tour. It should prove to be one of the best offsite artistic events to kick off the New Year of 2012.

Many experts and historians in the art world consider Clyfford Still to be one of the fathers of abstract expressionism. When he died in 1980 much of his work was unseen by the public. It was Clyfford Still's desire that this entire collection, almost 60 years of painting, drawings and sculpture, would be given to the city that would build a museum for it. Denver won out over 20 cities that were aggressively vying for this art treasure.

The inaugural opening of both the museum and the showing of his creativity met with rave reviews from all who attended. Many of Clyfford Still's works, that he did in the



1920s, are massive canvases filled with brilliant colors and jagged forms – an inspiration to any creative mind.

Vicki Tucker, our Programs Chairman, has arranged for us to have a guided tour of this newest addition to the so-called "corridor of culture" in downtown Denver. Finding Your Personal Style

you are passionate about a particular subject, technique, or process, focus on that. Research other artists that have painted the same subject, technique or medium that is exciting to you. Analyze the characteristics of each and without copying let it influence how you paint. Add your own touches of creativity. Ideally style develops over time with growth and development. If you're just starting to paint, a predetermined style stifles creativity. To find your own style, you need to have a few things going for you:

As artists how do we translate our life experiences into our paintings and express who we really are? We may have good work habits when it comes to our art, but how do we become clear about what we want to say? Further, you have to know what you mean by "style." Abstract, Impressionism, Realism are styles that have important historical significance that will no doubt guide how you develop your personal style.

Wikipedia says, "Style is a manner of doing something : different styles of management. A way of painting, writing, composing, building, etc., characteristic of a particular period, place, person, or movement. Style is a distinctive appearance, typically determined by the principles according to which something is designed.

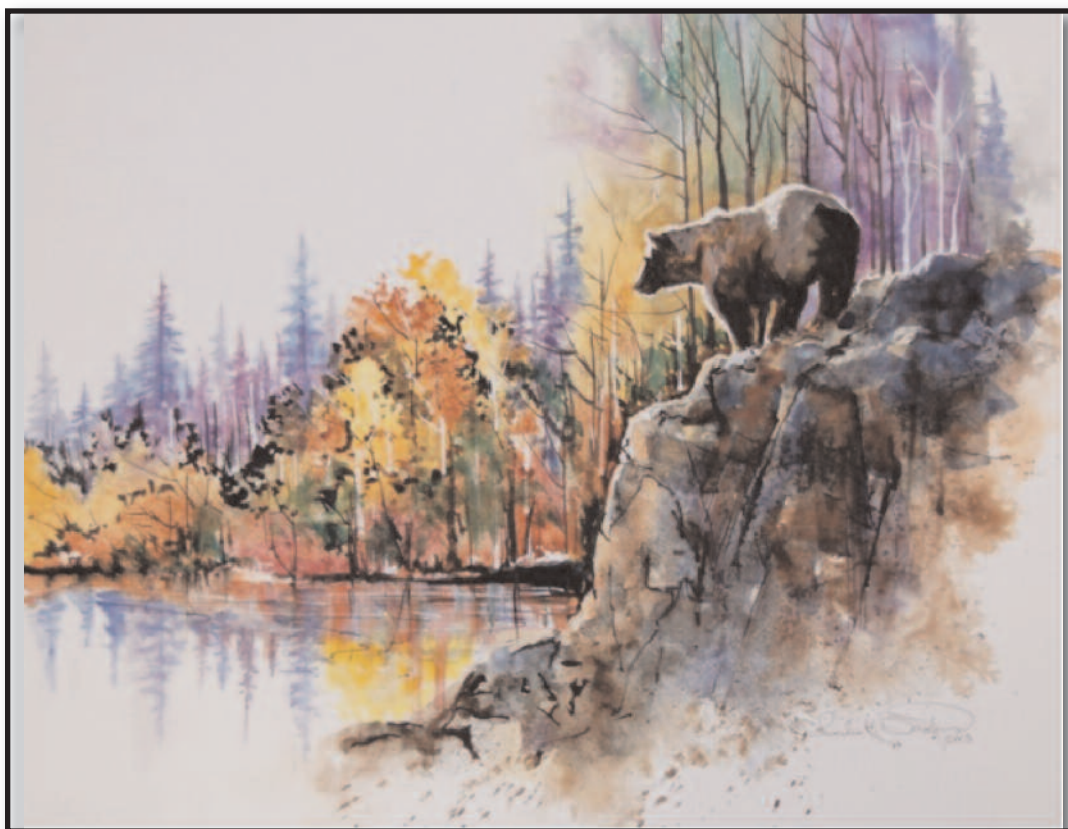
Part of being an artist is having an identifiable style, that special 'something' that enables someone to look at a painting and know that it was painted by you. If you want to sell your work in a gallery or create an image that people will remember, it's good to develop a look or "style" that is consistent. A particular painting style is something most galleries and art buyers will want to see in your work. Style in art typically is a combination of subject, color, and technique.

To identify your style first examine what you enjoy painting. If

Artists who work hard find their style. Work itself generates clarity and direction. Second, you need desire. Desire for knowledge, or perhaps an inexplicable compulsion to keep you moving forward. "Why this desire to paint"--I always ask myself--"if not the longing to discover my own values and beliefs." You also need curiosity. Wondering how things will turn out is more powerful than having a good idea beforehand. Wondering if you can do it gives you reason to try.

A good artist needs contentment. You need to feel happy with yourself while feeling the satisfaction that you're sharing it with others. Albert Schweitzer said: "Success is not the key to happiness. Happiness is the key to success. If you love what you are doing, you will be successful".

"What is my personal style?" should be asked by each individual artist. Good artists need to develop style as if on an island. To have a style is to be different, set apart, unique. Go to your island, put in long hours, fall in love with the process. There you will find your personal style.
