A message from our President

Fellow Artists:

If you read the letter I sent out to everyone last week, you will know that the February meeting has been cancelled due to the First Plymouth Church closing the facilities due to Omicron. The case numbers seem to be slowing down, so hopefully we will be back in person at the Church in March. I will keep you informed.

Our February program will be moved to a later month. In March, we will have a critique by our talented Diane Fechenbach. If you wish to participate, bring only one painting. Have it matted and not behind glass or plastic. When projecting the image, there is a glare with those materials. Just before the critique, Carol and I will do a short presentation on how to professionally frame your watercolor without glass or plexi, if you choose to do the newer procedure of varnishing your painting. Remember we now allow that in all our shows and several major watercolor societies also allow it, including NWS. But it is very important to present it differently than you would a matted and glassed painting.

At the March meeting we will also ask you to vote on an increase in annual dues from \$35.00 a year to \$45.00. The Board is requesting this increase, first because we have not had any increase in several years and we are well below what other watercolor societies ask of their members. Second, we have continued to have increases in our expenses such as insurance, rents for the Church and show venues, and our storage locker. At the end of the fiscal year, we are either just barely covering our costs or are sometimes over. We have a small cushion, but for a society as large and active as ours, it is not enough. So the Board hopes you will vote to keep your society running in the black. It's only .83 extra cents a month.

The last news I want to mention is that the Paint It Your Way show that was supposed to be the next show has had to be cancelled. It was to be in Aurora and at one of the city's new facilities. The city has had no experience working with a small non profit art show and their contract was prohibitive for our purposes. Their lawyers have agreed to rewrite the contract so that it will work for us, but not for this year. We will most likely use them next year for a different show. But do not despair, it was an extra show and we will still have 3 shows in 2022. The next one will be the State Show, then the Member's Show, and then the Theme Show. More info to come!

As for WFWS, there were 800 individual paintings entered and 130 were chosen by Juror lain Stewart for the exhibit in Albuquerque, NM. Out of 88 individual paintings entered from Colorado, 12 were chosen. More information to come about that after the opening in May. Good luck to our exhibitors and I hope one or more of you receive an award!

CVS SCHOLASTIC AWARD WINNERS



NOVEMBER 16, 2021 BOARD IN BRIEF

- 1. Carol Noted noted that Pat Rucker will not be able to do the January critique, so Carol will ask Pam Hake if she would be willing to do it.
- 2. Our new Treasurer, Bobbie Ruh, is making good progress in getting up to speed in understanding CWS operations and has created some new accounting systems that may be helpful. She presented several reports including a profit and loss statement for last month. Priscilla left things in good order and our bookkeeper, Joan Lund has been very helpful, sharing all her records.
- 3. CWS is scheduled to host the Western Federation of Watercolor Societies show in 2026, or possibly in 2025. The Board agreed the monies saved thus far for the show should be in a separate CWS account
- 4. The Board discussed how we should handle sales of paintings from our exhibits. Sometimes galleries want to handle the sales and, if so, the galleries collect any necessary sales taxes. Other times, CWS itself handles the sales and collects the taxes. Another option would be to have sales managed through a QR code system. Possibly this could even be done through our website.
- 5. Kathy, as Exhibits Director, reported the terrific news that she has secured venues for all our CWS shows through 2023!
- 6. The Board discussed the need to largely standardize our prospectus form for shows.
- 11. As Parliamentarian, Jay will send out to the Board the Policy changes that were necessitated by the recent Bylaw changes. These will then be posted on the CWS website for review and possible comment from the membership.



- 12. After a lot of deliberation the Board decided to recommend a dues increase to \$45 for general membership starting next year. At this point, with our dues at \$35, we have the lowest dues of any watercolor society in the Western Federation. The Board decided to ask the CWS membership to increase dues at the next general membership meeting.
- 13. As Director of Workshops, Sandy gave a brief update on upcoming workshops. Next year's State Show will be at Red Rocks Community College. The juror will be Keiko Tanabe.

JANUARY 18, 2022 BOARD IN BRIEF

- a. President Beatrice announced that there will be no "Paint it Your Way" Show due to insurance and contract difficulties with the City of Aurora. We plan to expand the permissible entries for the Member Show to include the type of work and framing that would have been included in "Paint it Your Way". There will only be three 3 shows in 2022 and in future years. The 2022 State Show will be at Red Rocks community College from June 1 to the end of September 1 with Keiko Tanabe as Juror and Gene Youngman as show chair. For 2022 the Theme Show will be at the Gilpin County Art Association from September 1 to October 26 and the Members Show will be at the Lakewood Cultural Center in November and December.
- b. Kathy Cranmer proposed a "Colorado People, Places and things" title for the themed show.
- c. The CWS Zoom contract will not be renewed at this time.
- d. Carol updated the program schedule: Timothy Standring, Curator for the Denver Art Museum, was proposed as the program for February discussing his approach to curating the "Whistler to Cassat" show. (Program later cancelled because the church was unavailable). For March, Diane Fechenbach, will be doing a critique.
- e. Bobbie updated the CWS Treasury status in two reports. The current month shows a negative balance of \$ 1,192.27. Income from the Member's Show will balance things out.
- f. Jay gave an update on where we are with Policy changes. He will work with Shanthi to post the changes on our website. He also noted that he, along with Bea and Jeremy had found a number of other policies that need to be updated because they contain restrictions that are no longer appropriate. These will be reviewed and presented later.
- g. Sandy announced that Randy Hale will present a workshop on April 20-22. Keiko Tanabe will lead a workshop on July 14-16. Rene Eisenbart will present a marbling workshop September 14-16 and Marbling Applied on September 21-22.
- h. Website Director: Shanthi Kumar:
- i. Shanthi reported that the CWS website name has been renewed.
- j. Membership Director: Elaine Campbell
- k. Elaine said CWS now has 356 members. It was suggested that the ability to pay online will be removed until the new \$45/year amount is approved. The change will be announced in the current Membership meeting and will be voted on in the next meeting.
- I. Amber announced that the next edition of Collage is planned to come out February 1. It will include the number of paintings that were sold at the Member's Meeting and the total amount that CWS cleared.
