I saw all the entries from all 10 societies and we are definitely in the running! Our next show, the Theme Show, On the Wild Side, is now open for entries and our next workshop with Kathleen Conover is on the website for sign-ups. She is one of the very top-notch watermedia artists to come to CO for us. She is a signature member of ALL the top watercolor societies and is extremely talented as well as a really nice person! So, sign up. We have a large light airy venue with lots of easy parking for the workshop.

Jay Breese, our very own retired jurist, and I have been working to slim down, reshape, update, and make sense of CWS policies and bylaws. They are terribly out of date and cannot be followed as written. So, we are working hard on that and will bring the revisions to you for a vote very soon. TBD! So, if you know of anyone who you think might be interested, including yourself, please contact me and we can talk or I will talk to them. If you think you are not qualified, now is the time to step forward to be involved in the remaining months of meetings to get yourself up to speed. That is also why the policies and bylaws are being slimmed, tidied and made more understandable, so that someone who is not as familiar with the workings of the Board, will have a clear document from which to go by.

If no one steps up, I will stay through September so that we may have our State Show and workshop with Matthew Bird. If we are closing down, I guarantee that the awards for the final show will be many and large so as to entice you to go out BIG! I hope this does not come to be, but time is running short and you all need to know what is what.

Create Dynamic Art! Starting a painting with color, texture, gestural marks and layers may seem like "chaos", but it delivers vital energy that is not only fun and intuitive but necessary. Design and composition are the elements that bring "order" to a rich start and turn it into an attention-getting and expressive finished painting. Beginner or advanced – you are encouraged to discover and explore your unique expression and personal imagery in realism, abstraction or non-objective painting. Demonstrations, a 9-page syllabus plus additional handouts, individual attention and independent work time will enable understanding and application of new information and processes. Specific lessons on creating exciting texture, expressive mark making, color concepts, layering, how to do a value study, understanding design principles and elements, mastering self-critique and more will be presented. "Most of all," Kathleen says, "I want to help each artist advance to the next level in their own work – no matter where they start." Bring your sense of adventure and
