



What's coming up for CWS Members

Plan to be ready early for **Western Federation of Watercolor Societies 2024**. It will be hot in Phoenix, so the show will be held earlier in the year. That means entries must be submitted between September 11 and November 27 this year.

The **2023 CWS State Show** will run from September 8 to October 14 and entries are due by July 31. Matthew Bird is the popular Juror and he'll lead a workshop. Sure, he does ultra real paintings but he covers a lot of subject types and will be teaching techniques that are useful to anyone wanting to advance their skills.

The **CWS Member Show** will be during November and December at the Lakewood Cultural Center again. It's an easy location to visit and nice gallery options. If you are a member, just pick your favorite painting and you're in!

Next year's **2024 State Show** will be held at the Curtis Center for the Arts starting May 11. Carolyn Lord will be the juror.

The **2024 Theme Show** returns to the Gilpin Art Association in Central City in September and October.

## CWS Board in Brief 5-16-2023

#### 1.0 Board and Committee Reports

**Jay Breese**, Parliamentarian, reported that we have more than enough votes for a quorum in the current election, and nearly all votes are in favor of the slate of candidates, the Policy changes, and the Bylaw changes.

**Bobbie Ruh, Treasurer,** reviewed the previously submitted Treasurer's Profit and Loss Report. Gross income last month was \$ 2,018 and Total Expenses were \$ 8,349.49 for a monthly loss of \$ 6,279.78 due to timing. The Theme Show had a net income of \$ 519 and there was a profit on the Conover Workshop.

- 2.0 **Meeting Expense:** Last year the church increased room rent by 40% to \$650 per meeting. For next year they plan to increase again by 7%. It was decided to continue the practice of having attendance at an art event in January rather than a meeting and that the June meeting would be a picnic where all members were invited to bring an example of current work for discussion and sharing. *This was approved unanimously.* 3.0 **WFWS:** Our regular dues were paid to WFWS and we will have enough in reserve
- 3.0 **WFWS:** Our regular dues were paid to WFWS and we will have enough in reserve to put on the annual show and events in 2026. Next year the show will be put on by AWA in Phoenix. It may be moved up to March to avoid hot weather.
- 4.0 **Exhibitions:** The call for entries in our State Show will be from June 1 to July 31. Delivery of paintings will be from 10 to noon on August 30 and the show will run from September 8 to October 15.
- 5.0 **Membership**: Elaine says that CWS currently has 381 members and 5 signature members have been archived since they no longer pay dues.
- 6.0 **Collage**: Jeremy asked that everyone send their information to Jeremy for the next Collage by July. Pages have already been created showing the CWS participants paintings in the 2023 WFWS show and we have lots to report about changes.

# June 20, 2023 CWS Board in Brief

- 2.0 **Board Members were sworn in** by Parliamentarian Jay Breese.
- 3.0 Board and Committee Reports
- 3.1 **The Curtis Center** has been reserved for the **2026 WFWS Show** and the **juror**, Xi Guo, has been selected.

- 3.2 **Workshop**: Only 5 people have signed up for the **Matthew Bird Workshop** during the State Show so far. Sandy will write an explanation to better explain the class and the techniques involved.
- 3.3 Issues with the **current meeting venue** have not been worked out. The cost is too high although there will be no January or June meeting at this location. The location will probably not be changed this year.
- 3.4 Andrew Ferdig was asked to create an a CWS Instagram Account.
- 3.5 Suddenly a baby shower broke out for Amber.
- **3.0Treasurer:** Bonnie Jones reviewed the previously submitted Treasurer's Profit and Loss Report. There were \$176.25 in gross receipts for the month but total expenses of \$3,007.70 due to timing resulting in a loss for the month of \$2,810.41.
- 4.0 Parliamentarian: Jay Breese stated that a few changes to policies were still needed. He called for tentative approval with the motion tabled until the next meeting. Policy changes will not require approval by membership but will be published in the minutes for any interested member. Terms of office will start following the June meeting. Also, no CWS member can be a juror in a CWS show according to original intent, so that change was corrected. The President will receive one free workshop and will not need to pay dues. References to the Historian, Librarian and Storage Manager will be removed. Jay moved for approval of these changes and was seconded by Richard and the changes were tentatively passed.
- 5.0 **WFWS:** Next year the WFWS Show will be put on by AWA in Phoenix. It has been moved up to March to avoid hot weather. Entries will be due from September 11 to November 27.
- 6.0 Exhibitions: Kathy said we have venues and show chairs for the balance of 2023 and 2024. We need jurors for the 2023 Member Show and 2024 Member and theme Shows.
- 7.0 **Membership**: Elaine will send out one more notice about paying dues.
- 9.0 Website: Amber noted that the CWS Facebook page has about 1,000 followers.
- 10.0 **President Chacon** made his first comments as President and thanked the Board for their offers of support for his efforts.
- 11.0 Andrew Ferdig was officially elected to the Board.
