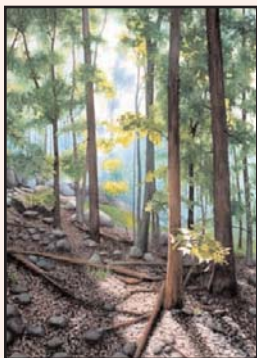
GENERAL MEETING

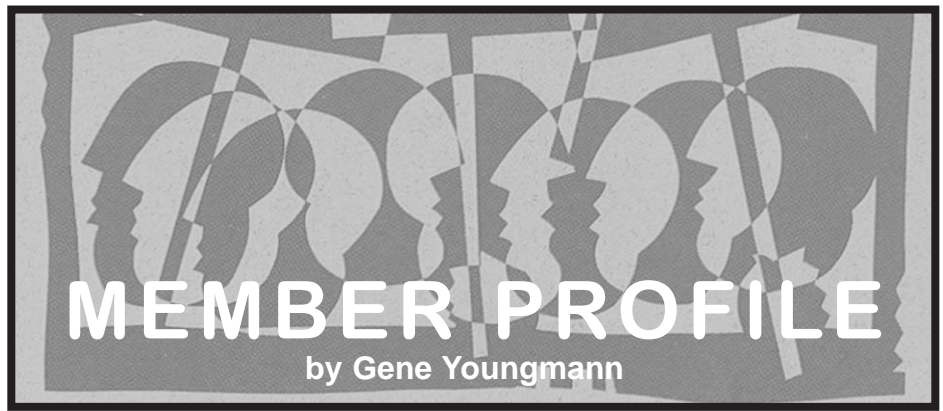

Sandra is also a WFWS exhibition artist.

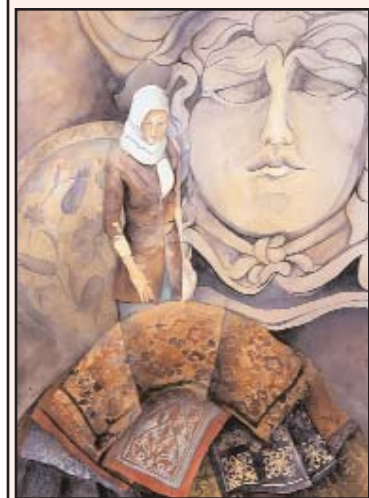
