Huge Book & Paper Sale planned for March

Mark your calendar and get ready for a once-in-alifetime opportunity that will happen at the March 21st Member meeting... March, not February.

A long-time and past member, Frances Olson, is in failing health and she and her family have made a generous gift to CWS - her entire art library that includes new and near-new watercolor instructional books – many are full-color, step-by-step, how-to watercolor books published by Watson-Guptil. There's close to 300 books, and almost all the big name watercolorists are represented.

A limited number of these books have been added to the CWS library and will be available for members to check out at a later date. But the rest of the books will be sold to our members at "substantial savings."

Frances spent a lot of time traveling around the world taking workshops and teaching watercolor. And during those travels she visited various paper manufacturers – she bought quite a bit of it and had it shipped to her Colorado home. Over 200

full sheets that include Arches (140 and 300 lb.), Fabriano (140 and 300 lb.), and others from England, Germany and the USA.

Even though she was a prolific painter, the stack of paper grew. The great thing about what remains of the stack is that CWS will use it for many, many more artistic creations. Frances would want it to be used that way. This paper will also be sold to our members at "substantial savings."

We have a plan for how the proceeds will be used, but that will be explained later. Mark your calendar for March 21st – you will be more than pleasantly surprised. All sales will be on a cash or check basis, and it will be yours to take home and enjoy.



The story of the discovery, settling and development of the west seemed to come alive with every painting — may painted by the great visual storytellers of a bygone era. The artistic creations of masters the likes of Charles Russell, Fredrick Remington, Albert Bierstadt and many more explode with emotion as they tell a story without words. Even three of Gutzon Borglum's paintings of the early west are on display — painted well before he carved Mount Rushmore.

Our guide began the tour as we were seated around a long wooden table in the main gallery. She created the mood and off we went, guided around the room as she clearly explained what each artist intended as he took up his brushes. It was a complete story. Wow!

And, so it went as we moved from painting to painting on three fantastic floors of visual stories. It was so easy to get inspired and motivated.





Our juror this year is Vladislav Yeliseyev.





Russian trained Vladislav Yeliseyev received his formal art education in 1977 and later earned his Master's Degree at The Moscow Institute of Architecture. Since then he moved to the United States and participated in numerous group and individual exhibitions. His unique ability to reflect transparency of natural light in his paintings and to accentuate the artistic qualities of the subject as juxtaposed with the natural environment quickly earned him a high reputation among the leading architects in the country. He painted thousands of watercolor illustrations for various commercial, residential and government projects such as Red Cross, Universities, Hospitals, etc. In 1992, Vladislav won the Formal Presentation Drawing Award from American Society of Architectural Illustrators. In 1993, his works were presented in group exhibition at Parsons School of Design and Vladislav was invited to teach a course of Architectural Illustration there in the following year. After receiving lots of inquires about his watercolor techniques, he released an

instructional DVD — watercolor workshop with Vladislav Yeliseyev "Painting Architecture".

Presently, Vladislav (Vlad) is practicing his art and conducting his architectural illustration business working on a wide range of projects with the clients from East to West coast from his own art studio in Sarasota, FL. Vlad is the owner of Vladislav Yeliseyev Architectural Illustration Company which he started in New York City in 1992 and now 20 years later, he founded Renaissance School of Art. The purpose of the school is to share his tremendous expertise with the professional community and to raise the skills of the young and amateur artists to the professional level.

Currently, Vladislav Yeliseyev is represented by Stakenborg Fine Art in Sarasota, Gallery Unique in Fort Myers and Collectors Gallery and Framery in Venice. His works can be found in private collections across the United States and Russia.

The 26th Annual State Watercolor Exhibition

Eligibility

Open to all artists, 18 years of age or older, residing in Colorado. CWS members who have moved out of state and maintained membership may enter.

Entry Requirements

- Paintings must be predominantly watermedia (watercolor, acrylic, gouache, casein or tempera) on paper or synthetic paper, completed within the last two years (1/1/2015 to present), and not previously shown in a juried exhibit in Colorado. No canvas.
- Painting must be original and not copied from any copyrighted material or
 photographs, except those taken by the artist. No computer generated (digital)
 art will be accepted. Collage materials must be on papers painted by the artist.
 It is the artist's responsibility to receive permission for any likenesses used in
 any painting.
- The Artist's signature should appear on the front of the painting. CWS
 reserves the right to refuse any painting that does not comply with the
 requirements stated in the prospectus or does not match the submitted image. In
 case of question, the Chairperson's decision will be final.
- CWS reserves the right to reproduce images of accepted works for CD sales, publicity and educational use.
- Entry form must be completely filled out. Prices and all information on this
 entry form is considered final and may not be changed. No exceptions. Entries
 without signatures or completed notification cards will not be processed.
- All work displayed must remain for the duration of the exhibition.
- Any requirements of the exhibit not fulfilled will result in disqualification.
 Works juried into this exhibit and not delivered for exhibit will prohibit the artist's entry in CWS exhibitions for two years.

Presentation

Minimum image size: 8 x 10 inches. All works must be delivered framed and ready to hang. Framing must meet gallery quality standards. Frames must be suitable to the work and the exhibit, must be undamaged and reinforced with hardware and picture wire in place. No sawtooth hangers.

All works must be matted in clean white or off- white mats. No exceptions. Colored liners or fillets may not be larger than 1/4". ALL paintings must be under Plexiglas. Paintings delivered with chipped, cracked, damaged, dirty or improper presentation will be returned at the artist's expense. For a list of suggested mat colors, visit www.coloradowatercolorsociety.org.

Digital Entries

One to three digital files may be submitted as an attachment to an email (be sure to mail in your entry form and supporting items) or on a CD enclosed with your entry form (CD's will not be returned). *Images must be jpeg format*, 1200 to 1920 pixels in the longest dimension, and 300 dpi.

IMPORTANT! To name your files: Use the first four (4) letters of your last name, the first four (4) letters of your first name, # of painting, shortened painting title: EiteSydn1Creation, EiteSydn2Curious

Write your name, address, phone, e-mail address, and image title(s) in the email or on the CD. Mail in your signed entry form and fees.
