

Sharon Rouse gave a presentation on options for the CWS scholarship money at the last Board Meeting. We will ask her to do a summary and recommendation on how to spend this money. We have \$650 in the account. A motion to donate \$500 was tabled until we have the review from Sharon.

The Scholastic Show will be at the Colorado History Museum in February and March. Greg C. and Terrey H. volunteered to review the 700 paintings and choose the winners of our five awards of \$100 each. Greg will present the awards in March.

Reports on potential show venues were given. A summary of each venue report will be placed on the Board notes on the website. Terrey H. reported that Foothills Gallery in Golden has agreed to host the State Show in 2020. Merrie W. reported that the PACE Center in Parker has the summer of 2019 open. It was agreed to firm this venue up for the 2019 State Show. The only venue that seems available for 2018 is the East Library in Colorado Springs. We will confirm this can be scheduled for May, 2018. Terrey H. will ask Frank Francese if he will jury this since he will be doing a workshop in May too. Priscilla will verify that Larry Haught will be chairman.

The Juror Committee consists of Steve Griggs, Terrey Harrod, Pat Rucker and Johanna Morrill.

Tim reported that the 2018 New Trends show will be at the Adventist Hospitals again. They will need electronic images submitted to the initial Healing Arts committee in July. They will select the show, the juror will choose the award winners. Gary Nichols will chair this show. The opening of the show will be August 31, the show will hang in September and October, 2018.


2018 Member Show

"Her Paris"

The CWS January outing to the Denver Art Museum was well worth the time. We were given a wonderful tour of the exhibit "Her Paris", a survey of women artists from 1850 to 1900. Thank you Beatrice Trautman for making these arrangements.

Our group was divided in half so as to provide a more intimate view of the exhibit. In my group, the docent concentrated on the history and customs of the time. The following statement is taken from the Denver Art Museum "Her Paris" Brochure. "Even though Paris was known as a cosmopolitan city. Parisian society was still very restrictive for women. They were not allowed to attend to the École des Beaux-Arts (School of Fine Arts)—the country's most important art academy—until 1897, and it was not socially acceptable to frequent public spaces, such as cafes, to work on their art and mingle with their peers without a male companion. The exhibition traces how, despite societal challenges, women embraced their artistic aspirations and helped create an alternative system that included attending private academies, exhibiting independently, and forming their own organizations, such as the influential Union des Femmes Peintres et Sculpteurs."

A Watercolor Helpful Hint?

A Watercolor Helpful Hint

I do a lot of lifting in my paintings. Some of it is done the standard way, but other large areas are done as follows:

- 1. Take painters tape and block out the areas that need to be lifted. Make sure the paper is completely dry.
- 2. I cut up a Mr. Clean sponge in 2"x2" blocks.
- 3. Take a Mr. Clean sponge (make sure it does not have any detergent in it) Wet it slightly and start rubbing the area gently, drying with a paper towel as you do the process. Often rinse out the small section of sponge. Replace the sponge tool as needed.
- 4. Be sure to remove the tape as soon as possible. At times, when the sponge was too wet it might have bled underneath the tape a bit. Just do some simple touch up repairs with your brush.
