### A Demo that will excite and encourage...

What better way to prepare for the summer season that is finally upon us than with a large helping of watercolor being presented to an awaiting white sheet of paper. And, have we got a great one for June. I recently sat down with Robert Gray to discuss his passion with a brush, and what I discovered will both excite and encourage you to pursue your love of watercolor through the upcoming months.

Robert Gray is one passionate artist and it shows when you hear his story and especially so when you watch him paint. His approach to painting will put a smile on your face when you see how he approaches his craft.

His pallet is a rainbow of pure colors which he rarely mixes on his pallet – imagine that. He lets the mixing happen on the paper – pigment, water and gravity are the active components to his creations. He uses a word like "homogenized" to explain his paint mixing process. And, it works great for him. It's something you have to see to completely understand.

He does a quick sketch, or not, and sometimes he follows it and other times he mostly ignores it, but it's there. And again, it works great for him. If you are getting curious, you are right where you should be - so was I.

Robert picks a brush, plunges it into water, then swirls it in a color and its applied to the paper – he repeats this process quickly and often. It sounds typical as to the way we all paint, but surprisingly different. His pallet too takes on an unusual appearance – you have to see it to fully understand it.

Robert proficiently paints with oils, acrylics and watercolor. His preference is watercolor, for reasons that will become obvious. His diversity of subject matter are from photos, props he has acquired or simply ideas that are in the memory bank inside his head and heart. He enjoys painting landscapes and the old west, especially cowboys and their horses.

There is another word Robert uses as he paints – it's called "balance." It comes into play every time he nears completion of a given painting. He explains balance by demonstrating how it works, and it does.

Mark your calendar for the fourth Tuesday in June – the 28th from 7-9pm at the First Plymouth Congregational Church (SW corner of Colorado Blvd. and Hampden) in Denver. It's the final meeting before the summer break. Plan on attending and invite a friend... all are welcome.




Creativity has always been a big part of who Sue is, and she knows how to grow it. "I never attended art school," Sue readily states, "I just love to draw... I see something and I draw it." That's what makes it fun for her and her voice reveals a level of excitement while sharing her story.

Sue happily admits to being a stay-athome Mom while raising children. And as such, she limited her art skills to sewing

and painting on T-shirts for family, friends or school projects for her children.

Her artistic endeavors took a positive turn when she was a teacher's assistant in Golden, Colorado. The teacher was a calligrapher and drew simple stick people. Sue enthusiastically said, "I can do that." And, she began helping to teach first graders to read by drawing triangular-shaped stick people and simple words with magic markers.





Her first artistic creations grew to 3'x4' drawings of faces in ink applied like watercolor and then colored with red watercolor. She liked the results and so did those around her. Once, while on trip to South Dakota, she saw drawings of the 7th Calvary at Little Big Horn. They needed a drawing of a native American, so she did two drawings for them to fill the void. Hmmm...

Then it happened... she did a pen and ink drawing and entered it in a show and it won first place! That led to enrolling in art classes at a senior citizens center. Then more classes through various art guilds in Littleton and Colorado Springs. "This is fun," kept coming up as her art progressed.

Now a member of CWS, her skill level has grown substantially as has the number of workshops she has taken and demos at our monthly meetings from various member-instructors. In the first CWS exhibition she entered, she got juried in and won a merit award. Way to go Sue!

Sue's diversity of subject matter, as these few examples show, has helped define her as an accomplished artist. And best of all she seems to be enjoying the process.
