Demo-Palooza a La-La-Palooza! And, more to come...

If you were at the February CWS meeting you got an eyeful of creativity that was "charged" with color unique to four of our members. They put it all out there and the results were beyond expectation in every sense of their work. Watermedia was pushed beyond the typical brush, paint and paper. The program at our February meeting -Demo-Palooza – had it all. Those in attendance were exposed to four completely diverse artists with different techniques.

Chuck Danford - demonstrated watercolor on yupo (plastic paper). His technique and control were amazing. He demonstrated how to create very fine detail by letting his colors, water and brush strokes do the talking – charging – lifting – flowing - wetting, all combined to display effects that defy the imagination.

Rita Campbell - demonstrated Encaustic. Beautiful colors in wax and strokes with the hot iron revealed exciting and unexpected results. "One of a kind" - the words she often used as her creativity took form. There's another word that was used as she did her thing... "Wow!"

Camille Scott - had her samples of Batik on rice paper to show the various steps of her unique skills to get to the beautiful results she creates. Color never looked better.

Judy Patti - demonstrated on scrap matt board or foam core what you can do with watercolor and the smoke from a candle. She called her creativity "5-minute paintings." Somehow, her paintings seemed like the culmination of years of knowing how to make water, paint and brush speak so colorfully.

Because painting with watercolors is an ever-changing process rather than a destination, everyone is encouraged to bring in a recent creation, finished or not, to seek a little direction. Let an expert commend you for your skills and also to give you some helpful hints as to what you might want to consider taking your creation to the next step.

Please, only one piece per member – matting and framing are optional and do not bring it in behind glass – it is hard for everyone to see your creation with the reflections from the lights in the room. Watch for an email blast prior to the meeting that will tell you who will be doing the critiquing.

Message from the President


I had the wonderful experience of attending this year's award ceremony of the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards Colorado Region. How encouraging to see so many talented youngsters and their amazing work receive recognition!

The CWS contributes the Young Artist Awards, and I was honored to hand them to five deserving students selected by our jurors Carla Rouse and Bonnie Jones.

Visiting the related exhibit just prior to the ceremony, I was thrilled to view great examples of art that has been only partially intellectualized. The works on the wall have been through the institutional filter of art teachers and jurors, but they still show the rawness and honesty of young hearts and minds. The technical skills were often surprising, but it was the overall evocativeness that stood out—these kids had something to say! Somehow adults forgot to tell these children that they are supposed to be a numbed generation that only stares at screens and texts abbreviated words all day long... their art is busy, bold, brave, and both engaged and engaging.

I was once in a near plane crash, and experienced the bonding with total strangers that results from common tragedy followed by shared elation. Evocative works of art can have that same power to make you feel like you shared in the pain and joy of its production, as if you suddenly know something profoundly intimate about this individual you have not even met. I had this sensation of communion with these artists of so many backgrounds, of another country, another generation. Two examples: One a photo from inside a drainage pipe, with a teenager silhouetted sitting in the entrance. and the light shape of the round opening plus the reflection on the water suggesting the shape of a keyhole; the other the extreme close-up watermedia portrait of a teenage girl looking straight at the viewer. Is the former a representation of the introspection, self-conflict and loneliness that goes with leaving childhood? In the latter, are the roles possibly reversed as it seems it is the artist who is looking up close through the frame of the painting at the viewer—is it this young person's openness and curiosity about the world that is being revealed? Inner truths are often clothed in fantasy and imagination, like the real toads in imaginary gardens mentioned by Gertrude Stein.

These and many other pieces made me stop and wonder, amused or intrigued, at how honest art can touch both the unique in the artist and the universal in all of us, at how what makes us so unique renders us so much alike. Much of our life is traveled in parallel with others, with only glimpses at each other at the frequent intersections, a theme I explored in my painting Parallel Lives... But if, as Joseph Conrad put it, "we live as we dream—alone...", then art is one such rare opportunity we have to open a window into each other's dreams.

2013 Scholastic Art Awards: The award goes to...

The Colorado Watercolor Society, represented by Marcio Correa, presented five \$100 Emerging Artists awards for achievement in watermedia to five talented middle and high school visual arts students. The winners, selected by CWS jurors Sharon Rouse and Bonnie Jones, were Robert Aldrich, of Arapahoe High School, K.K. Braza, Air Academy 11th grade, Caleigh Daugherty, The Vanguard School 7th grade, Madeline Rohner, Denver School of the Arts 7th grade, and Celia Schreiber, Lakewood High School 12th grade. These awards were a part of the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards, Colorado Region program.

Since the 1920's, The Scholastic Art and Writing Awards has encouraged and rewarded art and creativity in classrooms nationwide. This year in Colorado, over 4500 works of art were submitted and juried to about 500 pieces which were then displayed at the Rocky Mountain College of Art and Design. About 80 of these art works will be displayed at the Denver Art Museum in March. Over \$340,000 awards and scholarships were presented at the ceremony held January 14, 2013 at Jefferson High School.

The Colorado Watercolor Society is the only professional arts organization in the state recognizing young artists through its outreach program in this manner. Our congratulations to the winners, and to all the Colorado art teachers for their instruction and inspiration to a bright new generation of artists.





