Proposed changes to several policies were discussed. Changes that were passed by the board were:

- 1. All new members joining after March 31 of any year will become active immediately and their dues will be the full amount and credited for coming year.
- 2. If a members dues are not paid by August 1, the member will not be listed in the Members directory for the coming year. The directory is the official "roster" and distributed at the September meeting. Any members paying after that date are still listed as active on the website.

A sample easel from the storage unit was brought to the meeting. The decision was made to keep these nicer easels for potential use in the future. It will still allow us to move into a smaller space once excess paperwork and old files are discarded. This will save us approx. \$100 per month.






